


Poetry Ireland Writers in Schools Scheme

Writers in Schools Scheme

 Part funds visits by writers and storytellers to primary and post-primary schools across the island

Run by Poetry Ireland

Funded by Arts Councils North and South

 20,000 children and young people annually

• 150+ artists to choose from



Two hours contact time

- Time can be divided into sessions ie 2 x 1 hour/ 3 x 40 mins
- School contribution: €100 (half writer fee) paid to Poetry Ireland
- Poetry Ireland pays €100 + travel expenses in full
- Poetry Ireland issues payment to the writer

 Format of visit ie reading/Q&A; writing workshop; storytelling session, etc.

Genre: poet, children's/ fiction writer, storyteller

Submit online application form

 Advise to submit application as early as possible as demand high and funding limited



WIS Residencies

6-12 hours contact time

Single group

Max of 30 students

 Three-way funded: PI / schools / third party ie local county arts office



Quality experience for the child

- Strict artistic eligibility criteria
- Recruitment of artists to WIS Scheme includes interview and shadowing opportunities
- Provide professional development opportunities
- Select writers based on experience working with children and young people, diversity of panel, location, demand from schools in terms of genres, specialist skills ie Irish language, experience in special schools, etc.
- All artists garda vetted
