## 22 - 09 - 108 Director's Report

New Reporting Protocol- Members **noted** that the new protocol around presentation of matters for decision & matters for noting will be in place from October Plenary meeting onwards.

Forward Commitment: Festival Investment Scheme 2023- Members noted the update and agreed the forward commitment of €2.5m for 2023.

Culture Night additional Funding- Members noted that the recommendation had been previously circulated to Members, by mail in August and while all Members apart from Dónall Curtin, who objected for governance reasons, had approved the recommendation it was felt that it would be appropriate for the Council in Plenary session to again ratify the recommendation. Members **agreed** the recommendation.

Members noted the late confirmation of related Department funding and **agreed** that a letter should issue requesting that all sources of Departmental funding should be made known to the Council, as early as possible in the year. Members asked that issues of concern around late provision of additional funding be relayed to the Department in particular in the context of an event that had been in planning since in the early months of 2022.

Forward Commitment: University Residencies

Members **agreed** to maintain its 2022 level of funding commitment. Members noted that the Arts Council is not getting sufficient recognition for its investment. Members noted that the contribution from the participating universities is too low. Members **agreed** that the inclusion

of Technological Universities in the residency programme needs to be addressed. Members agreed that this matter must be addressed in advance of any further consideration of this scheme.


Members noted and **agreed** the report and recommendations of the Policy & Strategy Committee.
